Father Karl's Reflection

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel taken from St. Mark speaks of the "brothers and sisters" of Jesus. This terminology raises an interesting question: did Jesus have blood brothers and sisters—or stated differently, did Joseph and Mary have natural children after the birth of Christ? This might seem to be a speculative question, but it does matter. How are we to read and interpret the scriptures? It is possible to have different opinions and still be "right?"

This is a time when there is not a complete answer. In the fourth century the matter was debated. One opinion held that Mary and Joseph had children in the natural way after the birth of Jesus—these children would have been blood brothers/sisters to Jesus. St. Jerome, the great biblical scholar, argued against this opinion stating that from the earliest days the Church had understood that Jesus was the only child born of Mary. To definitively answer at least part of the question, in the seventh century the Sixth Lateran Council declared that, "Mary was "ever virgin and immaculate." Therefore, as Catholics, based on Sacred Scripture and Tradition, we do not believe that Mary and Joseph had other children and consequently that Jesus had blood brothers and sisters. It is interesting to note that the Orthodox Church, which is intimately connected with the Catholic Church in Tradition and doctrine, teaches that Joseph had children from a previous marriage—these individuals are mentioned in the Gospel of Mark. The Catholic Church has no particular opinion on this latter question.

The confusion arises over the translation of the Greek word adelphos—commonly translated as brothers and sisters but can mean cousins or any number of different relationships. This is a time when it becomes clear that the Sacred Scriptures are a gift to the whole Church and not so much to us as individuals. This is an occasion where the Church gives clear direction concerning the interpretation of Sacred Scripture. Christ promised the guidance of the Holy Spirit to the Church and through the grace of the Holy Spirit we have been taught with authority.

Decimocuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

El Evangelio de hoy tomado de San Marcos habla de los "hermanos y hermanas" de Jesús. Esta terminología plantea una pregunta interesante: ¿Jesús tenía hermanos y hermanas de sangre? O, dicho de otra manera, ¿tuvieron José y María hijos naturales después del nacimiento de Cristo? Esto podría parecer una pregunta especulativa, pero si es importante. ¿Cómo debemos leer e interpretar las Escrituras? ¿Es posible tener diferentes opiniones y seguir siendo "la verdad?"

Este es un momento en el que no hay una respuesta completa. En el siglo IV, el asunto fue debatido. Una opinión sostenía que María y José tuvieron hijos de manera natural después del nacimiento de Jesús; estos hijos hubieran sido hermanos de sangre de Jesús. San Jerónimo, el gran experto bíblico, argumentó en contra de esta opinión afirmando que desde los primeros días la Iglesia había entendido que Jesús era el único hijo nacido de María. Para responder definitivamente, al menos una parte de la pregunta, en el siglo VII el Sexto Concilio de Letrán declaró que "María es" siempre virgen e inmaculada". Por lo tanto, como católicos, basados en la Sagrada Escritura y la Tradición, no creemos que María y José tuvieron otros hijos, y, en consecuencia, que Jesús tenía hermanos y hermanas de sangre. Es interesante notar que la Iglesia Ortodoxa, que está íntimamente relacionada con la Iglesia Católica en la Tradición y la doctrina, enseña que José tuvo hijos de un matrimonio anterior; estos individuos se mencionan en el Evangelio de Marcos. La Iglesia Católica no tiene una opinión particular sobre esta última pregunta.

La confusión surge sobre la traducción de la palabra griega adelphos, comúnmente traducida como hermanos y hermanas, pero puede significar primos o cualquier cantidad de relaciones diferentes. Este es un momento en que se hace evidente que las Sagradas Escrituras son un regalo para toda la Iglesia y no tanto para nosotros como individuos. Esta es una ocasión donde la Iglesia da una dirección clara con respecto a la interpretación de la Sagrada Escritura. Cristo prometió la guía del Espíritu Santo a la Iglesia y por medio de la gracia del Espíritu Santo se nos ha enseñado con autoridad.
